What if Computers Could Read Our Lips?

ASSINACT
Silient speech that converts lip movements into text can mitigate many challenges of speech and traditional input methods. Yet, existing silent speech recognition models are error-prone or use impractical extremal devices or implants. In this talk, I will present the findings of three projects involving silent speech input. First, a social study established silent speech as an acceptable and desired mode of interaction. Second, two empirical studies revealed that users are more tolerant of errors in silent speech and tend to speak slowly when interacting with It. Third, a new end-to-end deep neural network that can automatically segment lip sequence videos and classify them into text. In an evaluation, the model reduced the word error rate by 57% compared to the state of the are without componenting the careful computation time. compared to the state-of-the-arts without compromising the overall computation time.

Dr. Ahmed Sabbir Arif leads the Human-Computer Interaction Group at the University of California, Merced. His research makes computer systems accessible to a wider range of users by developing intuitive and effective input and interaction techniques. A major thread of his work focuses on smarter solutions for text emective input and interaction decriniques, a major intend or ins work rocuses on smanter solutions for text entry, His other interests include mobile interaction, accessibility, and applied machine learning, He has received a Hellman Fellowship, three Michael A. J. Sweeney Awards, and a CHISIG Gittle Lindgaard Award for his research activities. Before joining UC Merced, he was a Postdoctoral Fellow at Ryerson University and an NSERC ENGAGE Fellow at York University, He received his Ph.D. in Computer Science from York University, He also holds an M.Sc. from Lakehead University and a B.Sc. from Trent University, both in Computer Science.

ABSTRAIC!

How can technology professionals assess whether their technology supports diverse users? And if they find problems, how can they fix them? Although there are empirical processes that can be used to find "inclusivity bugs" piecemed, what is also needed is a systematic method to assess technology's support for diverse populations. To fill this gap, we developed GenderMag, a method for finding and fixing "gender inclusivity bugs" — gender biases in technology interfaces and workflows. We then introduced inclusiveMag, which can be used to generate systematic inclusiveness methods for other dimensions of diversity, in this talk, we explain how GenderMag works, present the latest GenderMag texts, and then introduce inclusiveMag and our early experiences with it. We conclude with actionable steps for industry and university professionable.

DOING INCLUSIVE DESIGN: From GenderMag to InclusiveMag

She began her career in the industry, where she was the first woman software developer ever hired at Proceer 6 Gamble Noryadie. A few degrees later, she joined academia. She co-founded the area of end-user software engineering, which aims to enable computer users not trained in programming to improve their own software, and co-leads the team that created GenderMag (gendermag.org), a software inspection process that uncovers user-facing gender blases in technology environments. Together with her collaborators and students, she has contributed some of the seminal work in both of those areas, and also in explaining Al to ordinary end users. Burnett is an ACM Fellow, a member of the ACM CHI Academy, and an emeritus Chair of the NCWIT Academic Alliance.

This new scholarship is made possible through the generosity of two trailblazers who helped establish and grow UC Merced and are now making their already formidable footprint even more significant. This July, Christopher W. Swarth, former Reserve Director of the Merced Vernal Pool and Grassland Reserve and Project Scientist for the Natural Reserve System (NRS), and Marilyn L. 



# **AAEES GRAND PRIZE**

Professor Naughton Earns AAEES Grand Prize.

Professor Colleen Naughton has been awarded the 2021 Grand Prize in University Research by



the American Academy of Environmental Engineers and Scientists (AAEES). Naughton's lab created an online dashboard titled "COVIDPoops19" to plot the location of global wastewater testing for SARS-CoV-2 during the pandemic. With the help of graduate and undergraduate students, Naughton's team scanned Twitter, publications, news articles and webinars to find the latest information on testing results. ## UC MERCED MOVES UP IN U.S. NEWS TOP 100

Go 'Cats! UC Merced extended its historic climb in the U.S. News & World Report rankings, jumping to No. 93 among the nation's best universities — No. 38 among public schools and No. 18 among schools with R2 research status.

Last year, we rose into



the top 100 for the first time, tying at No. 97 with

UC Santa Cruz (which this year dropped to 103). In the latest rankings, released this week, U.S. News also ranked us highly on the "most innovative" (No. 57) and "best undergraduate teaching" (No. 58) lists among national universities.



# CARE OFFICE INVITES CAMPUS COMMUNITY TO FALL EVENTS



Read Our Lips?
Silent Speech as an Active
Mode of Interaction with
Computer Systems

### **ABSTRACT**

Silent speech that converts lip movements into text can mitigate many challenges of speech and traditional input methods. Yet, existing silent speech recognition models are error-prone or use impractical extremal devices or implants. In this talk, I will present the findings of three projects involving silent speech input. First, a social study established silent speech as an acceptable and desired mode of interaction. Second, two empirical studies revealed that users are more tolerant of errors in silent speech and tend to speak slowly when interacting with it. Third, a new end-to-end deep neural network that can automatically segment lip sequence videos and classify them into text. In an evaluation, the model reduced the word error rate by 57% compared to the state-of-the-arts without compromising the overall computation time.

#### BIO

Dr. Ahmed Sabbir Arif leads the Human-Computer Interaction Group at the University of California, Merced. His research makes computer systems accessible to a wider range of users by developing intuitive and effective input and interaction techniques. A major thread of his work focuses on smarter solutions for text entry. His other interests include mobile interaction, accessibility, and applied machine learning. He has received a Hellman Fellowship, three Michael A. J. Sweeney Awards, and a CHISIG Gitte Lindgaard Award for his research activities. Before joining UC Merced, he was a Postdoctoral Fellow at Ryerson University and an NSERC ENGAGE Fellow at York University. He received his Ph.D. in Computer Science from York University. He also holds an M.Sc. from Lakehead University and a B.Sc. from Trent University, both in Computer Science.

to InclusiveMag

### **ABSTRACT**

How can technology professionals assess whether their technology supports diverse users? And if they find problems, how can they fix them? Although there are empirical processes that can be used to find "inclusivity bugs" piecemeal, what is also needed is a systematic method to assess technology's support for diverse populations. To fill this gap, we developed GenderMag, a method for finding and fixing "gender inclusivity bugs" — gender biases in technology interfaces and workflows. We then introduced InclusiveMag, which can be used to generate systematic inclusiveness methods for other dimensions of diversity. In this talk, we explain how GenderMag works, present the latest GenderMag results, and then introduce InclusiveMag and our early experiences with it. We conclude with actionable steps for industry and university professionals.

### BIO

Margaret Burnett is a Distinguished Professor at Oregon State University. She began her career in the industry, where she was the first woman software developer ever hired at Procter & Gamble Ivorydale. A few degrees later, she joined academia. She co-founded the area of end-user software engineering, which aims to enable computer users not trained in programming to improve their own software, and co-leads the team that created GenderMag (gendermag.org), a software inspection process that uncovers user-facing gender biases in technology environments. Together with her collaborators and students, she has contributed some of the seminal work in both of those areas, and also in explaining AI to ordinary end users. Burnett is an ACM Fellow, a member of the ACM CHI Academy, and an emeritus Chair of the NCWIT Academic Alliance.



Dear UC Merced Undergraduate Students,

The Student Success Internship (SSI) program, now in its 7th year, provides UC Merced departments the opportunity to design internship positions for undergraduate scholars to complete professional projects. The interns are paired with department faculty and staff mentors who provide guidance and advice throughout the projects.

Over 30 projects are selected and students complete the project over the course of 6-8-months here on campus or at a satellite location. Funding for the projects is awarded through the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships as a scholar stipend and will be added to scholar financial aid awards.

#### The Student Success Internship Program is designed to:

- Involve students in the operation and development of the campus by drawing on student talent to contribute to the campus community.
- Provide students with learning, leadership, and project managerial experiences, as well as opportunities to enhance team-building, communication, time management, and delegation skills under the guidance of administrative personnel.
- Provide opportunities for students to build experiences and skills related to future goals and integrate them with their academic learning.

#### **Student Qualification and Requirements**

- Must be a currently enrolled undergraduate student with plans to be enrolled in both the Fall 2021 & Spring 2022 semesters.
- GPA requirement 3.0 or above.
- Students must have been enrolled for at least one semester at the time of application. First-semester transfer students are eligible.
- Students must be in good standing academically and in terms of conduct before and during the internship.
- Fulfill project contract requirements and learning agreement. Provided at the beginning of the project by the site supervisor.
- It is expected that students will dedicate 8-10 hours per week working on their projects.
- Projects are expected to be completed within 6-8 months. The SSI program operates between September 2021 through April 2022.
