




**What if Computers Could Read Our Lips?**  
Silent Speech as an Active Mode of Interaction with Computer Systems

### ABSTRACT

Silent speech that converts lip movements into text can mitigate many challenges of speech and traditional input methods. Yet, existing silent speech recognition models are error-prone or use impractical external devices or implants. In this talk, I will present the findings of three projects involving silent speech input. First, a social study established silent speech as an acceptable and desired mode of interaction. Second, two empirical studies revealed that users are more tolerant of errors in silent speech and tend to speak slowly when interacting with it. Third, a new end-to-end deep neural network that can automatically segment lip sequence videos and classify them into text. In an evaluation, the model reduced the word error rate by 57% compared to the state-of-the-art without compromising the overall computation time.

### BIO

Dr. Ahmed Sabbir Arif leads the Human-Computer Interaction Group at the University of California, Merced. His research makes computer systems accessible to a wider range of users by developing intuitive and effective input and interaction techniques. A major thread of his work focuses on smarter solutions for text entry. His other interests include mobile interaction, accessibility, and applied machine learning. He has received a Hellman Fellowship, three Michael A. J. Sweeney Awards, and a CHISIG Gite Lindgaard Award for his research activities. Before joining UC Merced, he was a Postdoctoral Fellow at Ryerson University and an NSERC ENGAGE Fellow at York University. He received his Ph.D. in Computer Science from York University. He also holds an M.Sc. from Lakehead University and a B.Sc. from Trent University, both in Computer Science.

**DOING INCLUSIVE DESIGN:**  
From GenderMag to InclusiveMag

### ABSTRACT

How can technology professionals assess whether their technology supports diverse users? And if they find problems, how can they fix them? Although there are empirical processes that can be used to find "inclusivity bugs" piecemeal, what is also needed is a systematic method to assess technology's support for diverse populations. To fill this gap, we developed GenderMag, a method for finding and fixing "gender inclusivity bugs" — gender biases in technology interfaces and workflows. We then introduced InclusiveMag, which can be used to generate systematic inclusiveness methods for other dimensions of diversity. In this talk, we explain how GenderMag works, present the latest GenderMag results, and then introduce InclusiveMag and our early experiences with it. We conclude with actionable steps for industry and university professionals.

### BIO

Margaret Burnett is a Distinguished Professor at Oregon State University. She began her career in the industry, where she was the first woman software developer ever hired at Procter & Gamble Ivorydale. A few degrees later, she joined academia. She co-founded the area of end-user software engineering, which aims to enable computer users not trained in programming to improve their own software, and co-leads the team that created GenderMag ([gendermag.org](http://gendermag.org)), a software inspection process that uncovers user-facing gender biases in technology environments. Together with her collaborators and students, she has contributed some of the seminal work in both of those areas, and also in explaining AI to ordinary end users. Burnett is an ACM Fellow, a member of the ACM CHI Academy, and an emeritus Chair of the NCWIT Academic Alliance.



Naughton's lab created an online dashboard titled "[COVIDPoops19](#)" to plot the location of global wastewater testing for SARS-CoV-2 during the pandemic. ## UC MERCED MOVES UP IN U.S. NEWS TOP 100

Go 'Cats! UC Merced extended its historic climb in the U.S. News & World Report rankings, jumping to No. 93 among the nation's best universities — No. 38 among public schools and No. 18 among schools with R2 research status.

Last year, we rose into



the top 100 for the first time, tying at No. 97 with UC Santa Cruz (which this year dropped to 103). In the latest rankings, released this week, U.S. News also ranked us highly on the "most innovative" (No. 57) and "best undergraduate teaching" (No. 58) lists among national universities. We also are No. 4 for creating social mobility for our students and No. 8 for the economic diversity of our undergraduate population. The undergraduate engineering program took a significant leap, from 145 to 131, on U.S. News' "best" list.

## DON'T BE BAITED BY A PHISHING SCAM

### Social Engineering Red Flags

**FROM**

- I don't recognize the sender's email address as someone I ordinarily communicate with.
- This email is from someone outside my organization and it's not related to my job responsibilities.
- This email was sent from someone inside the organization or from a customer, vendor, or partner and is very unusual or out of character.
- Is the sender's email address from a suspicious domain (like microsoft-support.com)?
- I don't know the sender personally and they were not vouched for by someone I trust.
- I don't have a business relationship nor any past communications with the sender.
- This is an unexpected or unusual email with an embedded hyperlink or an attachment from someone I haven't communicated with recently.

**TO**

- I was cc'd on an email sent to one or more people, but I don't personally know the other people it was sent to.
- I received an email that was also sent to an unusual mix of people. For instance, it might be sent to a random group of people at my organization whose last names start with the same letter, or a whole list of unrelated addresses.

**HYPERLINKS**

- I hover my mouse over a hyperlink that's displayed in the email message, but the link-to address is for a different website. (This is a big red flag.)
- I received an email that only has long hyperlinks with no further information.
- For instance, it might be sent to a random group of people at my organization whose last names start with the same letter, or a whole list of unrelated addresses.
- I received an email with a hyperlink that is a misspelling of a known web site. For instance, www.bankofamerica.com — the "m" is really two characters — "y" and "n."

**DATE**

- Did I receive an email that I normally would get during regular business hours, but it was sent at an unusual time like 3 a.m.?

**SUBJECT**

- Did I get an email with a subject line that is irrelevant or does not match the message content?
- Is the email message a reply to something I never sent or requested?

**ATTACHMENTS**

- The sender included an email attachment that I was not expecting or that makes no sense in relation to the email message. (This sender doesn't ordinarily send me this type of attachment.)
- I see an attachment with a possibly dangerous file type. The only file type that is always safe to click on is a .txt file.

**CONTENT**

- Is the sender asking me to click on a link or open an attachment to avoid a negative consequence or to gain something of value?
- Is the email out of the ordinary or does it have bad grammar or spelling errors?
- Is the sender asking me to click a link or open up an attachment that seems odd or illogical?
- Do I have an uncomfortable gut feeling about the sender's request to open an attachment or click a link?
- Is the email asking me to look at a compromising or embarrassing picture of myself or someone I know?

Phishing is the No. 1 threat delivery and communication vehicle in the world today, allowing cybercriminals to exploit system vulnerabilities to gain access to sensitive data, personally identifiable information (PII), and other valuable information. In phishing, cyber-criminals have a perfect attack and delivery tool: a digital medium used by almost anyone in today's connected world to conduct all types of real-time business that can carry any type of content, links, and attachments. It is anonymous, has an incredibly marginal cost to use, and is one of the most common services offered by the service providers.

Simply put: If you have an email address, you are a target. So you must be prepared <https://it.ucmerced.edu/security-campaigns>



Dear UC Merced Undergraduate Students,

The Student Success Internship (SSI) program, now in its 7th year, provides UC Merced departments the opportunity to design internship positions for undergraduate students to complete professional projects. The interns are paired with department faculty and staff members who provide guidance and advice throughout the projects.

Over 30 projects are selected and students complete the project over the course of 6-8 months here on campus or at a satellite location. Funding for the projects is awarded through the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships as a scholar stipend and will be added to scholar financial aid awards.

**The Student Success Internship Program is designed to:**

- Involve students in the operation and development of the campus by drawing on student talent to contribute to the campus community.
- Provide students with learning, leadership, and project managerial experiences, as well as opportunities to enhance team-building, communication, time management, and delegation skills under the guidance of administrative personnel.
- Provide opportunities for students to build experiences and skills related to future goals and integrate them with their academic learning.

**Student Qualification and Requirements**

- Must be a currently enrolled undergraduate student with plans to be enrolled in both the Fall 2021 & Spring 2022 semesters.
- GPA requirement 3.0 or above.
- Students must have been enrolled for at least one semester at the time of application. First semester transfer students are eligible.
- Students must be in good standing academically and in terms of conduct before and during the internship.
- Fulfill project contract requirements and learning agreement. Provided at the beginning of the project by the site supervisor.
- It is expected that students will dedicate 6-10 hours per week working on their projects.
- Projects are expected to be completed within 6-8 months. The SSI program operates between September 2021 through April 2022.

**How to Apply?**

**Internship positions for 2021-22 are now accepting student applications!**

How do I find and apply to a project?

**STEP 1:** Login and search on Handshake <https://umcmerced.handshake.com/login>. Use the keywords: Student Success Internships.

**STEP 2:** Apply. Submit your resume and cover letter to projects of interest.

**STEP 3:** Participate in the Selection Process. Using their selection process, the department will review resumes and select candidates to interview and select for the project.

**Do I Get Paid?**

A project provides students with the opportunity to apply classroom learning to real-world experiences. Upon completion of the project, the student will receive \$3,000 awarded through the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships as a student stipend and will be added to your financial aid awards.

## What if Computers Could Read Our Lips?

Silent Speech as an Active  
Mode of Interaction with  
Computer Systems

### ABSTRACT

Silent speech that converts lip movements into text can mitigate many challenges of speech and traditional input methods. Yet, existing silent speech recognition models are error-prone or use impractical extremal devices or implants. In this talk, I will present the findings of three projects involving silent speech input. First, a social study established silent speech as an acceptable and desired mode of interaction. Second, two empirical studies revealed that users are more tolerant of errors in silent speech and tend to speak slowly when interacting with it. Third, a new end-to-end deep neural network that can automatically segment lip sequence videos and classify them into text. In an evaluation, the model reduced the word error rate by 57% compared to the state-of-the-arts without compromising the overall computation time.

### BIO

Dr. Ahmed Sabbir Arif leads the Human-Computer Interaction Group at the University of California, Merced. His research makes computer systems accessible to a wider range of users by developing intuitive and effective input and interaction techniques. A major thread of his work focuses on smarter solutions for text entry. His other interests include mobile interaction, accessibility, and applied machine learning. He has received a Hellman Fellowship, three Michael A. J. Sweeney Awards, and a CHISIG Gitte Lindgaard Award for his research activities. Before joining UC Merced, he was a Postdoctoral Fellow at Ryerson University and an NSERC ENGAGE Fellow at York University. He received his Ph.D. in Computer Science from York University. He also holds an M.Sc. from Lakehead University and a B.Sc. from Trent University, both in Computer Science.

## ABSTRACT

How can technology professionals assess whether their technology supports diverse users? And if they find problems, how can they fix them? Although there are empirical processes that can be used to find “inclusivity bugs” piecemeal, what is also needed is a systematic method to assess technology’s support for diverse populations. To fill this gap, we developed GenderMag, a method for finding and fixing “gender inclusivity bugs” — gender biases in technology interfaces and workflows. We then introduced InclusiveMag, which can be used to generate systematic inclusiveness methods for other dimensions of diversity. In this talk, we explain how GenderMag works, present the latest GenderMag results, and then introduce InclusiveMag and our early experiences with it. We conclude with actionable steps for industry and university professionals.

## BIO

Margaret Burnett is a Distinguished Professor at Oregon State University. She began her career in the industry, where she was the first woman software developer ever hired at Procter & Gamble Ivorydale. A few degrees later, she joined academia. She co-founded the area of end-user software engineering, which aims to enable computer users not trained in programming to improve their own software, and co-leads the team that created GenderMag ([gendermag.org](http://gendermag.org)), a software inspection process that uncovers user-facing gender biases in technology environments. Together with her collaborators and students, she has contributed some of the seminal work in both of those areas, and also in explaining AI to ordinary end users. Burnett is an ACM Fellow, a member of the ACM CHI Academy, and an emeritus Chair of the NCWIT Academic Alliance.

The Student Success Internship (SSI) program, now in its 7th year, provides UC Merced departments the opportunity to design internship positions for undergraduate scholars to complete professional projects. The interns are paired with department faculty and staff mentors who provide guidance and advice throughout the projects.

Over 30 projects are selected and students complete the project over the course of 6-8-months here on campus or at a satellite location. Funding for the projects is awarded through the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships as a scholar stipend and will be added to scholar financial aid awards.

**The Student Success Internship Program is designed to:**

- Involve students in the operation and development of the campus by drawing on student talent to contribute to the campus community.
- Provide students with learning, leadership, and project managerial experiences, as well as opportunities to enhance team-building, communication, time management, and delegation skills under the guidance of administrative personnel.
- Provide opportunities for students to build experiences and skills related to future goals and integrate them with their academic learning.

**Student Qualification and Requirements**

- Must be a currently enrolled undergraduate student with plans to be enrolled in both the Fall 2021 & Spring 2022 semesters.
- GPA requirement 3.0 or above.
- Students must have been enrolled for at least one semester at the time of application. First-semester transfer students are eligible.
- Students must be in good standing academically and in terms of conduct before and during the internship.
- Fulfill project contract requirements and learning agreement. Provided at the beginning of the project by the site supervisor.
- It is expected that students will dedicate 8-10 hours per week working on their projects.
- Projects are expected to be completed within 6-8 months. The SSI program operates between September 2021 through April 2022.
