LANDSAT 9 LAUNCH





presents Landsat 9 Launch - With commentary by Dr. Erin Hestir, Professor of Geomatics, Department Civil and Environmental Engineering, UC Merced

September 16 or 17 (depending on conditions) Starting at 10a, launch expected at 11:11a

Join us for a live stream of the first Land Satellite Launch since 2013. We'll feature commentary from UCM's on-site witness, Dr. Erin Hestir, who relies on Landsat data to conduct research on water quality, invasive species, wildfire impacts, and biodiversity.

NASA's newest satellite will turn its two sensors towards earth. Both instruments have sensors with moderate spatial resolution—15 m (49 ft), 30 m (98 ft), and 100 m (328 ft) depending on spectral band—and the ability to detect the same range in intensity as Landsat 8, or better. Landsat 9 will be placed in an orbit that it is eight days out of phase with Landsat 8 to increase temporal coverage of observations.

COMPUTER SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING PROFESSOR, STUDENTS IMPROVE DATABASE QUERY RESULTS WITH NSF GRANT

Every time you surf the web, check your credit card balance, or even sign up for a class at UC Merced, you're using a relational database. Relational databases are basically the back end of operating software, aggregating information and

culling results based on your search or query. Improving the speed of these results is known as query optimization.

Rusu received \$499,870 from the National Science Foundation to fund his research on Compass, a novel query optimization paradigm that uses sketch data synopses.

Space Request/Room Reservation Updates

Instructional/Academic Spaces: Starting **July 16th, 2021** student organizations can begin requesting to reserve classroom spaces for their organization on ASTRA.

Non-Instructional Spaces: Starting **June 1st, 2021** – student organizations can begin requesting to reserve <u>non-instructional spaces</u> for Fall 2021 on <u>EMS</u>.

All room/space usage guidelines are here.

Please remember, all RCOs still need to submit event requests on <u>CatLife</u> in order for your event/meeting request to be officially approved. A room/space confirmation <u>does not equate</u> to an official event/meeting approval.

- Please **HOLD** on submitting any event requests on CatLife until **August 5th**, **2021** as we wait for our new platform.
- Our OSI, Fraternity and Sorority life team has prepared a Guide for Requesting Rooms/Spaces for all our clubs and organizations to use and reference. Please review to understand how to request to reserve any spaces for your upcoming events and meetings.

Fall 2021 Events Updates & Guidelines

Per University guidance all on or off-campus RCO events are <u>required</u> to be registered on <u>CatLife</u>. RCOs <u>must</u> have an <u>attendee registration/attendee</u> list after each event to ensure proper contact tracing in the event COVID-19 were to spread. You can utilize CatLife's system to check-in attendees.

The Executive Directive – UC Merced COVID-19 Mitigation Measures states **indoor gatherings of 50 or more** where the vaccination status of all is not known, *face coverings will be required*.

In order to make sure your organization's events are approved in time, please follow the OSI event approval process. OSI recommends submitting your large-scale events (50 people or more) 6 weeks in advance to ensure there is enough time to review. There are multiple campus partners and stakeholders who will also review your event. Any event or activity less than 50 people will take less time to review.

Please review the RCO Campus Activities and Event Guidelines for additional guidance.

Any event requests for COB 102 (Lakireddy Auditorium) or ACS 120, require Special Event Support from IT. If any other event you are planning that may need IT support, please make sure you request Special Event Support minimum of 2 weeks advance.

RCO Re-Registration/New RCO Registration

Annually, student organizations must renew their registration with the Office of Student Involvement (OSI). *It is important to register/re-register with OSI or RCOs will lose their privileges on campus.* Any new organizations will also need to register with our office in order to be active. Registration will take place on CatLife. Here is what you can prepare for in the registration cycle:

- *Updated* Registration Dates: August 5th, 2021 October 1st, 2021.
- A minimum of 4 members + 1 on-campus advisor. (On-campus advisors can only be a full-time staff member, faculty, or graduate student with their permission).
- Constitution/Bylaws which shall include a) the name of organization, b) a clearly defined statement of purpose, c) all requirements for membership including dues or fees, d) qualifications for holding office, if applicable, e) methods of selecting and replacing officers, if applicable, and f) documents explaining the nature of any formal affiliations the campus organization has with external organizations/agencies.
- It is recommended for clubs and organizations to include a diversity statement and have a Removal/Resignation of members process in their bylaws/constitution.

It is important to note, an organization cannot hold any meetings or events on or off campus UNTIL the organization is registered/re-registered with the Office of Student Involvement. The RCO registration dates are listed above.
