What will happen to my financial aid if I withdraw before the semester ends?

Federal regulation mandates that students who withdraw from all classes may only keep the financial aid they have "earned" up to the time of withdrawal. Title fW funds in excess of the earned amount must be returned, which could result in your owing money back to U. Merced. You can read more about that process <u>here</u>. Withdrawing may have other impacts too, like on lane repayment and Statistory Academic Progress. We highly encourage any student considering withdrawing to contact us to discuss how leaving UC Merced may impact your grant aid, loan repayment and eligibility for thure financial aid. 

LIVE IN THE VALLEY? YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR A FREE AIR FILTRATION DEVICE

Air pollution generated from wildfires is enormous and can well exceed the total industrial and mobile source emissions in the San Joaquin Valley, overwhelming all control measures and resulting in periods of poor air quality that can cause significant impacts to public health. In a well-sealed indoor environment (e.g., windows and doors closed and sealed tightly), HEPA air filtration devices can reduce particulate matter indoors by more than 90 percent.

To help mitigate the harmful health effects of wildfire smoke on Valley residents, and in particular the District's most vulnerable populations, the District has developed the Clean Air Rooms pilot program to provide residential air filtration units FREE to residents in Valley disadvantaged communities. 
Phishing is the No. 1 threat delivery and communication vehicle in the world today,

supported browsers for best results : **Browser -Version** Google Chrome - 57 and newer Microsoft Edge - EdgeHTML 14 and newer Mozilla Firefox - 52 and newer Mozilla Firefox ESR - 52 Microsoft Internet Explorer - 11 Apple Safari - 9.1.x, 10.0.x, 10.1.x, 11.0.x, 11.1.x allowing cybercriminals to exploit system vulnerabilities to gain access to sensitive data, personally identifiable information (PII), and other valuable information.

In phishing, cyber-criminals have a perfect attack and delivery tool: a digital medium used by almost anyone in today's connected world to conduct all types of real-time business that can carry any type of content, links, and attachments. It is anonymous, has an incredibly marginal cost to use, and is one of the most common services offered by the service providers.





On 12/04/2020, a NY judge restored DACA to its original state. The government must now accept initial DACA applications, renewal requests regardless of expiration date, and advance parole requests. DACAs previously renewed for 1 year will be automatically extended to 2 upper DACA has reopened for new applicants!
