He is a member of the American Academy of Environmental Engineers, the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the American Society for Engineering Education, and he is the recipient of several honors and awards for teaching excellence.

Dr. Matsumoto holds both Ph. D. and Master's degrees in Civil (Environmental) Engineering from the University of California, Davis, and a Bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from the University of California, Irvine.

Dr. Matsumoto's strong ties to UC Merced and the School of Engineering goes back to when he served as a member of the Campus Planning Committee during UC Merced's formative years -- from 2000 to 2003 -- assisting in the selection of academic majors, the creation of an academic administrative structure and the hiring of senior administrative leadership. In 2010, he also served for six months as interim Dean of the School of Engineering after the departure of the founding dean.

As Dean of Engineering, he served hundreds of undergraduate students each semester in teaching Engineering 191, Professional Seminar. He maintained an open door policy for students and hence may have also been found occasionally manning our front desk in the Engineering Suite.

Please join the UC Merced School of Engineering in thanking Dr. Mark Matsumoto for his years of service to the University of California. His contributions to UC Merced and the School of Engineering have been invaluable, and have paved the way for future student educational achievements!

LIVE IN THE VALLEY? YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR A FREE AIR FILTRATION DEVICE

Air pollution generated from wildfires is enormous and can well exceed the total industrial and mobile source emissions in the San Joaquin Valley, overwhelming all control measures and resulting in periods of poor air quality that can cause significant impacts to public health. In a well-sealed indoor environment (e.g., windows and doors closed and sealed tightly), HEPA air filtration devices can reduce particulate matter indoors by more than 90 percent.

To help mitigate the harmful health effects of wildfire smoke on Valley residents, and in particular the District's most vulnerable populations, the District has developed the Clean Air Rooms pilot program to provide residential air filtration units FREE to residents in Valley disadvantaged communities. 




Phishing is the No. 1 threat delivery and communication vehicle in the world today, allowing cybercriminals to exploit system vulnerabilities to gain access to sensitive data, personally identifiable information (PII), and other valuable information. In phishing, cyber-criminals have a perfect attack and delivery tool: a digital medium used by almost anyone in today's connected world to conduct all types of real-time business that can carry any type of content, links, and attachments. It is anonymous, has an incredibly marginal cost to use, and is one of the most common services offered by the service providers.
